ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION
OF
COMMUNITY CRIME PATROL

The undersigned, desiring to form a charitable corporation under Section 1702.01 et seq., Revised Code of Ohio, do hereby certify:

FIRST: The name of said corporation shall be Community Crime Patrol.

SECOND: The place in Ohio where the principal office of the corporation is to be located is the City of Columbus, Franklin County, Ohio.

THIRD: The purposes for which the corporation is formed are exclusively for charitable purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (or corresponding provisions of any future United States Internal Revenue law) (the "Code") in that the corporation will (a) promote social welfare by lessening neighborhood tensions resulting from the fear of crime and combating community deterioration and criminal behavior, and (b) support the governments of the City of Columbus and State of Ohio by assisting the various police departments of the City of Columbus and State of Ohio in the prevention of criminal behavior in and around the area including and surrounding The Ohio State University through (i) developing and implementing a community offensive against crime; (ii) motivating members of the public to cooperate with the various police departments and other law enforcement agencies within the City of Columbus and State of

Ohio; and (iii) developing and distributing to the public materials related to crime prevention.

FOURTH: The corporation is formed exclusively for purposes under which a corporation may be formed under the non-profit corporation law and not for pecuniary profit or financial gain. No part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to its trustees, officers or other private persons, or organizations except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in Article THIRD hereof. The corporation shall have the power, either directly or indirectly, either alone or in conjunction or in cooperation with others, to do any and all lawful acts and things and to engage in any and all lawful activities which may be necessary, useful, suitable, desirable, or proper for the furtherance, accomplishment, or attainment of any or all of the purposes for which the corporation is organized, and to aid or assist other organizations whose activities are such as to further, accomplish, foster or attain any such purposes. No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation (except to the extent provided in Code Section 501(h)), and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of (or in opposition

to) any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, the corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by a corporation exempt from federal income tax as an organization described in Code Section 501(c)(3) or (b) by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under Code Sections 170(c), 2055(a), and 2522(a), or (c) by a corporation not a private foundation under Code Section 509(a).


FIFTH: Upon the dissolution of the corporation, the Board of Trustees shall, after paying or making provision for the payment of all of the liabilities of the corporation, dispose of all of the assets of the corporation exclusively for the purposes of the corporation in such manner, or to such organization or organizations organized and operated exclusively for charitable, educational, religious, testing for public safety, literary or scientific purposes as shall at the time qualify as an exempt organization or organizations under Code Section 501(c)(3) and as organizations described in Code Sections 170(c), 2055(a), and 2522(a), or to the federal government, or to a state or local government, for a public purpose, as the Board of Trustees shall determine. Any of such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by the court of Common Pleas of the county in which the principal office of the corporation is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations, as said Court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.

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
